New Playgrounds Coming!

After a year's worth of planning, we are excited to announce that the church is ready to install new playgrounds. Our current playgrounds have aged and are in rough shape, but through the good work of many people, we have approved plans to replace them with useful, commercial-grade equipment.



We need your help to make this plan a reality! The Session is offering a 2-to-1 match for all gifts for these playgrounds. Thanks to prudent saving of the distributions from the Alpha Endowment Fund, we have the ability to make your gifts go far. Starting on Sunday, March 15, we will begin our fundraising, planning to be fully funded by Easter. The members of First Presbyterian and the

families and friends of Joyful Noise are joining forces to make this happen.

We know that these new playgrounds are going to be a great addition to our church facility. They will benefit our weekday Joyful Noise ministry immensely. They will be a good place for the community to spend time at the church. We believe that this will also broadcast how much we care about children, bringing new families to the church.

Your generosity to this project is essential and appreciated. How exciting it is to see these ideas becoming reality!

New Attention on Visual Arts

One of our four Core Values states, "We are created to create." A subcommittee of Worship formed to propose ways to promote the visual arts in our church. Their work has come to the Session for approval, and we will begin seeing changes in our spaces related to the visual arts. Already a mural by one of our artists, Jane Stoepker, is taking shape in the Gathering Area. The mural highlights our core values. In the coming weeks, we'll have new callery lighting installed to highlight the



weeks, we'll have new gallery lighting installed to highlight the work of artists in our congregation and community.

Steps Being Taken to Enhance Safety

For more than a year the Safety Committee has been evaluating how to best make our building a safe space for all who enter it seven days a week while ensuring it is a welcoming space for all. This is challenging work because it goes far beyond what happens in the sanctuary on Sunday mornings. Session took two actions on the recommendation of the Safety Committee at its last meeting. First, the church is acquiring panic buttons to be placed with strategic people and in good places throughout the building. When pressed, these buttons connect with local emergency personnel immediately. Second, we are now recruiting volunteers to join the Mobile Usher Safety Team (MUST). These special ushers will be focused on the safety of the congregation on Sundays. If you have interest in joining this team, please contact the office for more information.

Grateful for Legacy Giving

All of these projects moved forward because of the legacy giving of the church. Over the past couple of years we have been careful in using the proceeds of the endowment funds, which allowed the Session to take each of these significant actions. We are blessed to have endowment help, and we are eager to grow our Ferry Legacy Society to strengthen the ministry of the church for decades to come.

On the cover of this issue of *Tidings* we highlighted several actions taken by the Session that were the result of months and sometimes over a year's worth of meeting, thought, and prayer. The Safety Committee has been meeting for two years now, trying to perfect the balance of security and welcome in a very busy building. The efforts to make the playground a reality made their way through several

committees – Joyful Noise, an ad hoc Playground Committee, Generosity, and Trustees – before the final proposal came to the Session. This work takes time, but with committed members and patience, we believe that this work leads to thoughtful, faithful, and positive results for the church. Lenten Sermon Series: Spiritual Disciplines

Dear Church Family,

I'm looking forward to our sermon series for Lent. We will explore why spiritual disciplines such as worship, confession and celebration are important to do together as a community centered on Christ. In a culture and an age where there is so much emphasis on the individual, it's hard to see why coming together for worship is important. Individual time with Jesus Christ is important, but in addition to our personal time with Jesus Christ, it's just as important to be with others who are also doing their best to follow Christ. We generally give up individual time with Christ to focus on communal time with Christ and vice versa, when in reality we need both.

In the Bible we see that God worked in and through communities. In the Old Testament God worked within and through the community of Israel. God commanded Moses to find other trusted people to help in the leadership of Israel. (Numbers 11:16). Jesus had a team of disciples. The early church realized they needed more leaders to visit those in need and this couldn't fall on the teachers (Acts 6:3-7). We weren't meant to be on this journey of faith alone. God made us relational creatures and it's in relationships with other Christ followers that our faith is challenged, strengthened and deepened. Worship, confession and celebration are no different. The early church took worship seriously as a community (Acts 2:46). One of the first things the first believers did was

confess and repent *together* (Acts 2:36-39). Psalm 118:24 states "This is the day that the Lord has made. Let *us* be glad and rejoice in it." In closing Hebrews 10:24-25 is a great description of what Christ-centered community looks like:

And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching.

--Hebrews 10:24-25

Rev. Cathy Chang, Juan Lopez, & Aurelie Serving Christ Together in the Philippines

Cathy and Juan focus their vision on people whose dreams have been denied. They collaborate with Asian churches and non-government organizations to assist with efforts to end the scourge of modern-day slavery. Both can look back on their family histories and find evidence of forced migration, a reality experienced by many victims of human trafficking. The two carry a deep concern for those whose hope for a better life for themselves and their families has been dashed by forced labor and/or sexual abuse by human traffickers.



Based in Manila, the Rev. Cathy Chang serves the Southeast Asia region as the regional facilitator. Her husband, Juan Lopez, works with partner churches and social workers in trauma-healing. They both walk alongside global partners in their efforts to address these issues. Rev. Chang asks for our continuing prayers for their work, and for the people of the Philippines whose lives and businesses are suffering from the aftermath of the Taal volcano ashfall and flooding.



"How to Read Genesis" Beginning March 8

Continuing the "How to Read the Bible" series, beginning on Sunday, March 8, we turn from talking about how to read it to actually reading it! And why not start at the beginning?!

Genesis raises lots of questions for contemporary readers: Did God really create the world in six days? Was Eve really formed from Adam's rib? Did people really live to be 900 years old? Did God really flood the entire Earth? Did God really command Abraham to sacrifice his son? Over four weeks we will discuss such questions and examine how to read an ancient text like Genesis and listen to how God is speaking to us in it today.

- Week 1: The Creation, Genesis 1.1-2.25
- Week 2: The Creation and Fall of Human Beings, Genesis 2.1-4.17
- Week 3: God's Promise to Noah (The Flood and New Creation), Genesis 6.5-9.17
- Week 4: God's Promise to Abraham, Genesis 11.27-25.11

Life After Loss Support Group

Life After Loss is an ongoing grief support group open to anyone in the community dealing with a death related loss. The group is offered every first Monday from 1:00 - 2:00 pm and third Thursday from 6:30 - 7:30 pm and is facilitated by a Hospice bereavement counselor. Participants receive emotional support as well as educational resources that explore the many aspects of dealing with grief. Family Lenten Devotionals

Lent is not just about giving something up, but also a time to refocus on living in a Christ-Centered way. Lent is a time we retell stories of Jesus' ministry on earth, the events of Holy week leading to Jesus's death and resurrection. It leaves many families asking, "where do I begin?" This year we have two Lenten devotionals to help you engage with God as a family and demystify the Lenten season. Choose the one which fits your family best (you are welcome to use both!):

A is for Ashes This small portable booklet contains 47 alphabetically themed prayers for Lent. Short daily prayers--one for each day of Lent, from Ash Wednesday to Easter. These rhyming prayers help us understand the symbols we use in

Lent and God's larger story of salvation.

Illustrated Children's Ministry: The Last Seven Words of Christ. This family guide, has a weekly devotion and coloring page. This is helpful for busy families on the go, you pick

the day that works best for you to read it together. Journey through the last seven statements Jesus said to have a deeper understanding of his love and more meaningful Easter this year.


