# Update from the Session

The Session has been meeting over Zoom since mid-March. Its predominant focus has been adjusting the ministry to this time of social distancing. They have made two significant decisions in their recent meeting:

- The Session applied for and received a loan from the Paycheck Protection Program of the CARES Act. This loan is particularly helpful to FPGH because it allows the church to keep paying the staff of Joyful Noise while very little revenue is coming in due to their closure. This loan can be forgiven, and the church is collecting the paperwork to file for forgiveness.
- Because of the mandates to keep gatherings below ten people, the Session decided not to hold funerals or memorials at the church until these restrictions loosen. Pastors are able to minister to families for small graveside services.

The Session appreciates your prayers as it navigates these unfamiliar waters.

# **Staying Connected**

Even though we are forced to be physically apart from each other, we are committed to staying connected with our church family. Here are ways we can still be together:

## Missions Supported by the Mission Committee: The People Center

The People Center is one of the organizations supported by our Mission Committee. It is located at 307 Exchange Street in Spring Lake. The purpose of The People Center is to provide a safe place for people of the area to come, to be heard, and to receive practical assistance in an atmosphere of dignity and trust. The entrance is accessed from the parking lot off M-104/Savidge Street, and it has a blue awning over the door.

The People Center first opened its doors and its heart on June 4, 1996.

Since the beginning, our intention has been to welcome our neighbors to a safe and honoring place when life becomes stressful and anxious.

From its humble beginning of one home that housed a food pantry, a clothing hutch, and a single efficiency apartment, The People Center has grown. In 2004, The People Center responded to the needs of over 1,800 guests, the vast majority of whom live in the greater Tri-Cities area!

In 1998 and 1999, the second and third apartments were opened to house families in need.

On July 28, 2005 The People Center celebrated the grand opening of its third home, Samantha's Place.

The three apartments in Samantha's Place double the amount of transitional housing The People Center is able to offer the people of our community. The emerging People Center campus now includes six transitional apartments in three homes and continues to provide food and clothing.

With one paid part-time employee and a staff of over 60 volunteers, we are able to help families in our community.

In March 2010, with generous donations from our community, we became the proud owners of our current properties.

The current hours of operation are Monday & Wednesday 11 AM – 3 PM. Food donations can be dropped off during the above hours. No clothing donations are being accepted right now. Currently, there are no volunteers, but they will be needed in the future. Call 616 844-6710 to volunteer.


## **Special Pentecost Offering**

On Pentecost Sunday, May 31, we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit. This celebration is marked by receiving one of the four PC(USA) special offerings. The Pentecost Offering helps nurture the faith of those who are the future of the church—children, youth, and young adults.

It has been a particularly difficult season for our students. Though these last several weeks have been hard, it has been a true honor to watch all of our youth continue to move forward in faith, hope and respect. We have been amazed by their ability to remain positive and seek out ways to connect with one another and help others. Just last week one of our 6th grade girls made bracelets to raise money for Mercy Health's Covid-19 relief fund. How amazing is that? Even in the midst of facing painful cancellations and difficult adjustments to new normal, our youth continue to inspire.

Unfortunately, aspects of our youth ministry program have not been

exempt from a long list of cancellations. The Youth Committee had to make the difficult decision to cancel both of our mission trips this summer: the middle school mission trip to Byron Center and the high school mission trip to Belize. Though we have had to put a hold on spending physical time with our mission partners, we continue to be dedicated to serving alongside them even from a distance. Because of the efforts of our Youth Belize Mission Team and the generous donations made by the congregation, we were able to raise \$4,903 to help support Koinonia Ministries in building their childcare facility. This is a *huge blessing* to them and they are extremely grateful.

The Youth Committee remains passionate about instilling in our

students the understanding that mission trips are more than traveling to a destination. The important work

of loving and caring for our neighbors continues! Stay tuned for more ways the church can support and encourage our students in mission.
