From Reverend Troy Hauser Brydon

Last October the Session spent two evenings doing some visioning for the church. We dreamed. We talked about the kind of church we are. We talked about the kind of church we'd like to be. One of the results of that visioning was that we decided to have a summer Sunday worship service outside at the new and improved waterfront stadium. I've heard that churches used to rotate using the stadium for Sunday worship, but that practice had disappeared long before I arrived in town four years ago.

The hope in having an outdoor service was that we could get outside of our four walls and into the community so they might see how special First Presbyterian is. We do not do a lot of things that intentionally invite others to be a part of our special church (something we're working on!), but having a public-facing worship service is a step in the right direction. Session's hope in planning this was that it was a chance for all who are apprehensive about returning indoors with others might find comfort in the wide open space of the stadium. In doing something different, it is also Session's hope that all of us would invite others to come to worship that day. It might plant a seed of faith. It might give someone a taste of missing community. It might be a place for us to grow our wonderful church.

So, join us on Sunday, July 18 for worship at the Lynne Sherwood Waterfront Stadium. We'll only have that one service that day. The service will use elements of both our worship services to remind ourselves of the gifts we share across services. We'll have the Gathering Band, hymns, the choir, and so much more. We'll take an offering, so you can bring your offering with you. Any loose offering (cash or checks that specify "LIA" in the memo) will go to support Love in Action, the wonderful ministry that helps so many in our community. When we finish the service, Temptations will have ice cream and toppings for those who've been a part of worship that morning. (It's a new take on coffee hour! But we're calling it Sundae on Sunday.)

I was in the waterfront stadium with Harry Nienhouse and Maryanne Beery this week. Standing on the stage made me realize that this is quite the facility and that's it's pretty large. Wouldn't it be amazing if we had hundreds of us show up to be the church together on July 18?

I've missed seeing so many of you, and I hope we can get acquainted again that day. Let's celebrate the beautiful area in which we live and the joy of being a Christ-centered community. See you soon.

Dear Church Family,

I hope you are enjoying summer! As I write this I'm trying not to get too depressed about how fast this summer is already flying by. The Aragon Bruce household went back into our "normal" pattern of signing up our kids for late spring/early summer baseball and softball and camp for the kids. We're taking time to visit family in Seattle and Minnesota. Having not done any of the above in the past year it was a shock to the system of getting back into the mindset of figuring out who was going to go to which kid's game and who was going to drop off or pick up etc. It's been crazy getting back into this type of schedule, which is all the more reason I'm grateful for the focus of our current sermon series of "Living 24/6."

I was chatting with a friend, who is also a pastor, who made the observation that of all of the Ten Commandments, we don't feel bad about (or maybe even revel in or brag about) breaking the commandment to take a sabbath. In my last

Tidings article I shared about Credo, a conference I attended virtually in mid-May about sabbath, rest and renewal. I have to be honest with you and admit my commitment to a sabbath lasted only for about two weeks after Credo. I've fallen off the sabbath band wagon.

I'm ready, however, to get back on! I hope you are too. As with any of our commitments there is bound to be a point where, for various reasons, we don't (or can't) follow through. Well, today is a new day! With Christ every second is a new beginning. I keep thinking about what Troy said in his sermon on Iune 20th: "Sabbath is less about obedience as it is about abundance." God doesn't ask us to do something for the sake of just doing that thing. God asks us to do something because it will bring us the fulfillment we truly crave, but that we try to find anywhere but in God. In the end, whatever action God calls us to do it will lead us to abundance because it will lead us back to Jesus Christ himself.

Perhaps your schedule is such that you aren't able to take an entire day for a sabbath and it's more realistic to take "sabbath moments." Could vou squeeze one morning or afternoon this week to revel in God's creation? Could you take an hour to read a Psalm and use the words of that Psalm in a prayer? Do you have an hour to go out to lunch with a friend and talk about how you can be praying for them that week? Don't forget there's a whole list of sabbath practices to choose from that's available in the entryway of the Clinton Street entrance. My hope and prayer for all of us is that we would be intentional about carving out the time to rest and relax, but above all to remember who we truly are: Christ's beloved for whom he gave his life so that we could have abundant life.

From the Racial Justice Committee Why Were Our Church Bells Ringing on June 1, 2021?

The Racial Justice Committee partnered with St. John Episcopal Church and Church of the Dunes to ring the church bells at noon for five minutes on June 1st, to commemorate the 100th Anniversary of the Tulsa Black Wall Street Massacre.

During the Tulsa Race Massacre, which occurred over 18 hours from May 31 to June 1, 1921, a white mob attacked residents, homes and businesses in the predominantly Black Greenwood neighborhood of Tulsa, Oklahoma. The event remains one of the worst incidents of racial violence in U.S. history,

and, for a period, remained one of the least-known. News reports were largely squelched, despite the fact that hundreds of people were killed and thousands left homeless.


As we continue to grow and learn what it means to be followers of the Gospel teachings, we reflect on all of God's people who were unjustly killed and had their community destroyed at the massacre. Our prayers are for justice as God works through us to battle racism.
