From Rev. Kristine Aragon Bruce

Dear Church Family,

As one of your pastors I know I should have ready words of hope in light of recent mass shootings. I am writing this the day after 21 individuals, 19 of which were children, were killed by an armed shooter in Uvalde, TX. The gunman was legally an adult, but let's be honest, at only 18 years old he was just a kid himself. I wish I had words of hope for you, but at the moment I only feel anger, sadness, and fear. Since I became a mom, school shootings have become more common. There have been several mornings when I yell at my kids to hurry up to get dressed, eat breakfast, brush their teeth etc, that I've said to myself: "Be gentle, Kristine. They might be shot in school today." That may seem dramatic, but here's the thing...it's not. If we take a look at where school shootings have happened,

they've happened in wealthy and not-so-wealthy areas. In schools where the population is diverse and where the population is not so diverse. In southern, northern, western, and Midwest states. School shootings can and have happened everywhere. This is the world we live in and one I navigate as a mother.

While I don't have words of my own I find comfort in the words of Psalm 88, which starts this way: "O Lord, God of my salvation, at night, when I cry out before you, let my prayer come before you; incline your ear to my cry." The author then goes on to say in verses 11-14: "Is your steadfast love declared in the grave or your faithfulness in Abaddon? Are your wonders known in the darkness or your saving help in the land of forgetfulness? But I, O Lord, cry out to you; in the morning my prayer comes before you. O Lord, why do you cast

me off? Why do you hide your face from me?"

It's not a happy Psalm, but what I find comforting about it is that it gives us permission to grieve, feel hopeless, and be angry even if our anger is toward God. It's not a Psalm that supports an absent God, but a God who listens and walks with us even when we may question God's love and presence with us. I know this to be true even though my feelings say otherwise. By the grace of God I'm hanging on to this truth even if it's by a thread. I also take comfort in the fact that while I'm barely holding on, God continues to hold onto me. And God is holding on to you too.

In Our Church

From The Earth Care Team

As a team, one of our goals is to reduce our building's energy footprint by lowering our usage of energy. We researched solar panels, building enclosure, lighting and heating/ cooling. Through the help of Michigan Gas Utilities, MYSECO, Rycenga Electric and others, we created an initial plan to reduce our energy consumption and lower our utility bills. Our first step was to implement an easy task, replacing lighting within our church with LED bulbs, as the incandescent and fluorescent lamps burned out. We are now considering replacing all remaining lighting with LED, which will provide us with a three-year payback and save an estimated \$1,350 on our electric bills from that point forward.

Heating circulation pumps will be replaced with more energy efficient units as current pumps require replacement. This alone is an estimated \$865.00 annual savings. After a cooling system evaluation, we learned that new controls can be programmed and adjusted remotely from a computer or cell phone by a designated person(s). This is estimated to save another \$2,210 per year by better temperature control, only cooling areas of the church which will be occupied vs. our current system which doesn't allow this much flexibility.

The control systems are being evaluated in more detail, considering when these more expensive changes should be implemented.

The Earth Care Team will continue to work toward new energy savings, with the goal of having a positive impact on our environment.

We're excited to announce a new partnership with First Pres and Griffin Elementary School: Kids Hope.


We are looking for people willing to build positive, caring, one-on-one relationships with students. All children face challenges, but some hurdles are bigger than others, and sometimes kids need a little extra support to build resilience and hope. Kids Hope USA mentors (supported by behind-the-scenes prayer partners) spend one hour per week talking, reading, playing, and listening to a child at school. Research shows that by helping a child feel loved and valued, the child can better learn, grow, and succeed.
