We hold staff meetings weekly on Tuesdays. At that meeting, Tina Ramones leads us through the upcoming church calendar, making sure the whole staff is aware of all that is happening ministry-wise and building-wise. Three years ago in the early stages of Covid, that was a really fast part of the meeting. Largely the calendar sat empty. That is no longer the case! And almost every week as we finish the calendar reading, someone on staff proclaims, "Where is the year going?!?"

I'm feeling that way as I write this, realizing that we're turning to May, which means wrapping up a lot of the program year. There are only a couple more youth group meetings. We'll celebrate our graduates on May 21, the same day that some of our students will receive their diplomas from Spring Lake High School. The Sunday after is Pentecost, where we celebrate the start of the church following Jesus' resurrection, but that's also the kickoff to summer season in our beach town.

Summer is always a welcome change of pace and weather. Many of us take vacations. All of us will enjoy the long days, warm weather, and the glories of summer in Michigan. Around the church it means that we're doing lots of things that are one-offs, easy to drop into when you're around. That includes another Waterfront Worship service this July 16 (mark your calendar!). It includes the Youth Mission Trip to Pennsylvania. As your life adjusts to the relaxed summer schedule, I pray you'll find ways to participate in the life of your church beyond worship.

Finally, I invite you to consider coming on a fall trip to serve our partners in Belize. I was last there in 2019. We had a youth team go in 2022 — after two years of delays. I'd love to rekindle our work there and to witness what God is doing in this partnership. I would love to share more information with you between services on May 14, so you can consider if this is something God is calling you to share in. This will be my fifth trip to Belize to serve with Koinonia over the past decade. I know that I always find my faith stirred and my worldview stretched in partnering internationally. I hope you'll consider joining me!

From the Farth Care Committee **RECYCLING UPDATE**

Good News! Our church has signed a new recycling contract with Republic Services. Under our previous arrangement we could only recycle paper and cardboard. With this new agreement we may now recycle additional materials such as glass, metals, plastic containers, and paper-based cartons. Collection is "all-in-one" meaning that all recyclables are placed in one bin with no sorting required. All of this has been accomplished at a slightly reduced cost from our original contract.



Along with the new recycling program, the church begun composting. Composting allows for the recycling of kitchen waste and other organic materials. This includes the compostable cups and plates the church has been temporarily using while the kitchen dishwasher has been inoperable.

As the church has been making these transitions, we thank the congregation for their patience and willingness to make the programs a success. We especially thank the church staff for their commitment and help in implementing these changes. Finally, the next time you see Joleigh, give her a special hug or hearty handshake!


