I was under the mistaken impression that things slowed down in the summer. Evidently, I was wrong. It's hard to believe I'm already writing about July when it feels like summer has hardly even started!

July is an exciting month for the church, especially because we're going to have our third straight Waterfront Worship service at the Lynne Sherwood stadium in downtown Grand Haven. This year's edition will be on July 16th. (Don't worry. The loud boats are the next weekend!) After three years of doing this service, I think we're hitting our stride.

What can you do to be ready for it? First, plan to be there. Make sure you have sunscreen and a nice hat too. Perhaps you'll want a bag chair too. Second, plan to bring others with you. We had over 700 in attendance last year, which is double what we have on a typical Sunday in our pews. Invitation is a key to this. Third, make sure you're friendly to those you meet. Some will be there just for that outdoor worship experience. Others will be there because they're look-



ing for a great church. We're a great church, so they're in the right spot! Be welcoming! Fourth, pray for great weather — and a slight breeze. This only works if the weather cooperates.

This service is one of the unique parts of being a church in Grand Haven. It's something we enjoy but do not take lightly. I really hope you can make it.

Summer also brings lots of kids to Christian summer camp. Did you know that we have a program that underwrites a significant portion of the cost of going to a faith-based summer camp? The program extends to many churches beyond ours, and I'm pleased to report that we've been able to support more campers this year than ever before. While the application window for financial support for 2023 is now closed, I hope you'll keep this in mind for 2024.

For now, include these campers in your prayers. I know many of us — myself included! — found my faith challenged and deepened through Christian summer camp. A piece of that was the prayers that supported us while there. This is a praying church, so pray for your campers.

I know summer brings lots of comings and goings. While you're in town, I hope you'll worship with us. We're here every Sunday! See you soon.

Dear Church Family,

Happy July! I hope and pray you have (or had depending on when you're reading this) a safe 4th of July. Growing up, I remember waking up on every 4th of July to my Dad blasting the song "Proud to be an American." It was both endearing and annoving. Since both of my parents were immigrants, the 4th of July was more than just a day to enjoy BBQs, pool parties, and firework displays, although we usually did participate in all of the above. For them, it was a day to celebrate the new life they were able to build in the United States that was not possible in the Philippines. At the time of my parent's immigration, the Philippines was under the dictatorship of Ferdinand Marcos. Under his authoritative rule, anyone who spoke against his tyranny conveniently disappeared. This

included politicians and journalists in addition to many others. I am thankful for my parent's brave decision to leave everything they knew behind, including some family, to build a new and better life for themselves, my sister, and me.

As a Christian, I am thankful most of all for the freedom we have in Jesus Christ. In Jesus, we know we are deeply loved and when we rest in Christ's love we are truly free—but free from what? Free from whatever tells us we aren't worthy of love. value, and respect. When we don't feel loved, valued, or respected our tendency is to do whatever it takes, even if it is at the expense of the well-being of others or ourselves. to prove that we are indeed worthy of those things. Our sinful nature convinces us that we need to fight others or put others down for our own survival and well-being. Jesus

tells us, however, that we are all equally worthy, valued, and loved in God's sight. In Jesus, we are all free from trying to prove to others that we are worthy of love, because Jesus has already proclaimed that we are by what he accomplished on the cross.

My hope for all of us on this 4th of July is that we would reflect on the true freedom that is only found in Jesus Christ. When we do we are freed from the lie that we aren't worthy of love and therefore must fight to prove that we are. This frees us up to truly see and serve others as God sees us all. Our perspective shifts from preserving not just our own well-being, but the well-being of others. We are thus truly free to love and serve others in Jesus Christ.

Project Ripple Effect 2023

Project Ripple Effect is back after a 4-year hiatus, and we need your help in identifying worthy organizations that may need just that little bit of extra financial help. In 2019, your FPGH mission committee distributed one-time-only distributions for 12 out of the 21 organization requests and ranged from \$250 to \$1,000. The total distribution was \$5,000.

Some examples from the 2019 requests included funding for tutors, scholarships, funds to build handicap carts, and funds for a clothing closet, just to name a few. This year we want to do even more and have committed up to \$10,000 to worthy causes that you help identify.

A Perspective on the Earth Care Team

This is a perspective on the dedication of the Earth Care Team (ECT) from church members, Bill and Carol Bedford, who upon rejoining the church after living in the Chicago area for 10 years, were asked to join the ECT. After attending several meetings, Bill was very impressed with the dedication of the members: Sara Shambarger, Bob Day, Sally Dunn, Ginger Aubrey, Dave Gritter, Michele Smith, Brock Hesselsweet, and Eric Snyder.

Carol is on the team to help our congregation and our community become aware of ways we need to work toward protecting God's environment. She, with the help of church member Aaron Portenga, enlisted the help of the Grand Haven High School GREEN group, which Aaron advises at school, to participate in local Earth Day activities. The GREEN group

designed and distributed digital posters to publicize the movie "Microplastic Madness" shown at the church and at both the Loutit and Spring Lake Libraries. In the movie, 5th grade students learn action is an essential part of caring for Planet Earth.

The ECT's efforts at the April 29th Earth Day activities—marching in the parade which promoted recycling and electric vehicles and staffing the FPGH booth designed by Michelle Smith at Central Park Center—are just a small part of the activities and efforts that go on throughout the year. Ginger Aubrey's efforts as coordinator of the Earth Day Lakeshore planning were rewarded with exceptional participation in the march and at the fair. There were over 30 booths. The pastors, staff and congregation participate in the large and small daily activities that will help diminish harmful pollution and global warming. We now have energy saving lighting; reusable or compostable plates and utensils at

church functions; a start toward composting and recycling; and a change in the church landscaping.



This is all part of the multi-page, daunting, 142-step procedural outline of steps the Presbyterian Hunger Program requires from the congregation each year to be a certified "Earth Care Congregation." We hope the FPGH congregation will continue to make every effort they can individually and as part of groups to support the ECT, because as we all know: "Knowledge is power and can lead to action."


