

### From Rev. Dr. Troy Hauser Brydon

There really are two beginnings in the year. There's New Year's Day, a time when so many of us make resolutions to set the tone for the coming year. There's also the start of the school year, which is also the start of the church's program year. Like we do for New Year's, I'd like us to consider making some School Year's Resolutions. Why?

The past few years have been hugely disruptive to life. We are all well aware of that. It's my observation, however, that those disruptions took space many of us gave to life together as a faith community and gave it to many other things. Some of this occurred naturally — schedules filled in with other activities. Some of this also is the result of breaking faithful patterns of worship and study that were in place before 2020. As your pastor, one of my chief goals is to keep each of us connected to the gospel, and sometimes that means I have to wave my hands and call for your attention to say, "Hey! We miss you. Remember us? We need you and deeply want to see you live a full life while following Jesus!"

This is one of those seasons where I am doing just that. We miss you. We cannot help shape your faith and the faith of your family when you have little to no connection to the church. I see so many of you out and about in the community — at restaurants, at games, at parks — and I would love the chance to add church back into the matrix of your good, busy lives.

So, what School Year's Resolution will you set this fall? Is it getting to worship in the sanctuary twice a month? Is it gathering with a couple other friends to pray for and encourage one another? Is it finding a new way to serve alongside your church on Sundays or by doing ministry on a committee? Whatever it is, intentionality is the key to making a change. I think it's very important for all of us to take stock of our lives in these days to see how we can better nurture faith in our lives, in our homes, and in our church.

You're a part of this church because you love it. Here's my fear: If we take the church for granted, not only will it keep us from growing in faith personally, but also we will watch something we care about struggle to meet its mission because of inattention. That is a tragedy that is entirely avoidable, and it takes each one of us stepping forward and resolving to tend to our faith individually and together.

So, what will your School Year's Resolution be? See you soon!

#### Dear Church Family,

As I write this it is my kids' first day of school. Both are headed to new buildings and for the first time, we don't have a kiddo in elementary school (insert tears here). I had plans last June for how I was going to prepare our kids for their big transitions, Jenson beginning 5<sup>th</sup> grade at White Pines and Phoebe beginning 7<sup>th</sup> grade at Lakeshore Middle School. None of those plans panned out. What did happen was that our annual July trip to Seattle was pushed to the week before school as that worked best with my Seattle family's schedules. The result was that the last days of summer were about getting slowly acclimated back into the Eastern Time Zone (I was a zombie at both of my kids' school orientations last week) instead of peaceful moments set aside where I would lead my children in thoughtful times of prayer regarding their hopes for the upcoming school year.

It's the thought that counts, right? I still want to be intentional about helping my kids see Jesus in their midst as they go about their days, but I realize I need to be more realistic about what that looks like. Jenson has football practice twice a week and Matt is his assistant coach (I may or may not have committed him to this without his permission... follow me for more marriage hacks), Phoebe will most likely join the tennis team and take private violin lessons. We still remain committed to dinner every night as a family. where we will check in about our days and perhaps try to talk about Jesus. My point is we will need to be creative about carving out time as a family to spend time with God, even if it's only 5, 10 maybe even 15 minutes. However, I believe God will still honor that time even if it's not what I envisioned. Our faith journeys rarely go the way we plan, and that's okay!

On a completely different note, an article was published in the Grand Haven Tribune about the Unifying Pastors Coalition Forum that took place on August 17<sup>th</sup>. If you have a Grand Haven Tribune subscription you can read the article <u>here</u>. I was a panelist for the forum and as I shared with the Session and Pastor Troy, I was there representing *myself*, not First Presbyterian Church of Grand Haven. Unfortunately, this was not captured correctly by the

headline of the article: "Church Coalition Calls out Ottawa Impact" as it is not a coalition of churches, but a coalition of pastors, like myself, who don't necessarily represent their congregations. In addition, the first sentence of the article is also incorrect as it begins with the statement "Four faith leaders representing their respective churches of the Ottawa Coalition of United Congregations." I realize and honor that we as a church have not signed the statement released by the Unifying Pastors' Coalition and that not everyone in our congregation shares my views. I regret that this was not communicated correctly in this article. I am grateful that I serve a congregation in which there are various opinions regarding a whole host of issues, but is still committed to unity in Jesus Christ. ### Introducing Table Dwellers

Table Dwellers began with a small group of families meeting in homes and asking the question, "How might God be calling us to join together in the rhythms of discipleship and mission in our lives and in our neighborhoods?" This question led to gatherings in homes focused around fellowship, prayer, and hearing the Word. It also got them working in their neighborhoods on composting, a way for them to serve their neighbors and care for God's creation. Some members of First Pres are also engaged with Table Dwellers.

First Pres supported Melisa Overway when she became trained as a YogaFaith instructor, a ministry she offers at the church. The Table Dwellers group has committed themselves to helping set up and tear down for these classes

as well as helping care for the folks who gather for prayer through YogaFaith.

In August, Table Dwellers celebrated two baptisms in Lake Michigan with families who had no church connection.

The Session committed to partner with Table Dwellers by praying for them, continuing to provide space for YogaFaith, helping them with good financial practices, authorizing the sacraments and maintaining records as required by *The Book of Order*, and meeting with them to share their joys and challenges. We look forward to seeing Table Dwellers flourish and witnessing how God will shape us in this partnership as well.
