

From Rev. Dr. Troy Hauser Brydon

Our first fall together in 2017, I asked the congregation to read Dallas Willard's *Divine Conspiracy,* which is a fabulous if pretty hefty look into Jesus' Sermon on the Mount. (I still feel a great deal of gratitude that you stuck that journey out with me!) When asked about what the church needed more than anything else these days, here's how he responded.

"I can state without wavering that the single greatest need of the church today is the restoration of ministers. What is required is a quite different approach to their life and work. It is a matter of leading them into a massive shift of the dynamics of their personality under God, and one that cannot be done by more books and conferences. They need to be taken out of circulation for a sufficiently long time to re-vision and re-structure their lives in communion with Jesus and his kingdom."

I am so grateful for this opportunity to take a sabbatical. It will be good for me. It will be good for my family. It will be good for the church. I was just reflecting with a friend the other day that I am a different pastor in 2024 than I was when I started in 2007. This will be a time to dwell more deeply into who I am becoming as a pastor so that I can be at my best for the church.

This time will allow for rest, which is something I'm not particularly good at. It's a time to renew personally, professionally, and relationally. It's a time to recall why I'm a pastor and to seek more deeply God's calling. It's also a time to reinvest as I prepare for the next chapter of ministry.

I appreciate the many well-wishes I've already received. I want you to know that the church is in great hands and that there are plans in place to engage well in worship and ministry in these months. Pastor Kristine will take over as Head of Staff and Moderator of session. We have all Sundays covered for preaching and worship leadership. We have plans in place to ensure good pastoral care. The church staff is strong and committed, and I am confident that they will do well in this time.

Once the sabbatical begins, I will stay away from all church activities and connections. I won't be looking at my email. (In fact, all summer emails will just get deleted unread upon my return, so if you need something, please contact the office.) If you see me around town, say hello, but let's not talk shop. This radical unplugging will help me to keep my focus where I need it during this time — on rest, renewal, recall, and reinvesting.

Finally, I am eager to return to ministry with you. Taking this time is a sign that I am committed to being your pastor for our next season. I look forward to doing so renewed, refreshed, and ready to go in the fall. God bless you all. I'll see you at the end of the summer.

"To every thing there is a season . . ." Ecclesiastes 3:1.

In April's *Tidings,* Pastor Troy noted that "Summer is a time for the church to be at rest and renewal," noting that like his sabbatical, this summer "offers a similar reset for the whole church."

Note the closeness of the definitions of sabbatical and sabbath—a period of rest. God has given us both the gifts of Seasons and of Sabbath—a time to rest, a time to renew, a time to replenish.

In this Summer Season, together, we can follow Troy's faith-filled suggestion to engage in a "Big Read," joining him as a congregation in reading Ruth Haley Barton's *Embracing Rhythms of Work and Rest.*



Let us join together rhythmically to celebrate First Presbyterian's "Summer of Sabbath."

Embracing Rhythms of Work and Rest is available in hardcover; audio; and Kindle; and locally at the Bookman; as well as on Amazon. Each of the 13 chapters ends with questions for journaling and discussion. The Bookman is ordering a copy of *Embracing Rhythms* for people to look over.

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Our Food Truck Mission

Twice a year, First Presbyterian Church sponsors a food truck locally. The need and desire for fresh produce in our area continues to increase.

The food that is distributed varies, with the most recent truck providing potatoes, split peas, raisins, oranges, cottage cheese, apples, milk, and sausage patties. When an organization sponsors a food truck, they pay about 13 cents per pound of food.

The last food truck sponsored by FPGH served 181 households, totaling 513 people, including 137 children, 190 seniors, and 38 veterans. Thank you for helping to fight food insecurity in our community!
