

# From Rev. Kristine Aragon Bruce

Dear Church Family,

Time is a funny thing. I was thrilled when I learned that our school district decided to move the first day of school to after Labor Day, which is when school used to start before we moved here. For this summer, I had all of these plans for day and weekend (minus Sundays of course) trips and was looking forward to more downtime with my family. That being said, it's a shock to my system that it's now July. What happened to June? I would like another June, please.

I don't think I'm alone in thinking I have more time than I have to make special experiences happen, regardless of the season. Every fall I vow to drive up north to see the beautiful autumn colors. Have I done that yet? Nope. Every winter I vow to try cross-country skiing at Pigeon Creek. Has that happened? Well, I did go sledding with my kids there once. I would love to finally take my kids for a day trip to Mackinac Island this summer. Given my track record, there's a good chance that won't happen.

Psalm 118:24 states: "This is the day that the LORD has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it." (NRSVUE) While I'm behind on my goals of creating fun experiences for myself and my family, this doesn't mean I can't be thankful for each day God gives us. We tend to think that we need to go away and experience a new place or activity to create core memories for our children or perhaps even for ourselves. While that can of course happen, we can't fall into the trap of thinking that special memories are *only* possible during extraordinary experiences. Memories that last a lifetime can take place in the mundane and ordinary routines of our daily lives. Notice that Psalm 118:24 doesn't state that we are only to rejoice in the day the Lord has made when we're away on vacation or engaging in a special activity. Those days are definitely worth rejoicing, but not any more so than we do about ordinary days.

Please don't understand me as saying you shouldn't jump on the chance to get away and rest, as we all need that. What I am saying, however, is that each day, whether we're at home or traveling elsewhere, there is always something for which we can thank God. Each day is full of gifts from God and each day itself is a gift from God. Each day holds so many possibilities for lifelong memories. My hope and prayer for each of us this summer is that we will be more intentional with our gratitude for Jesus Christ and the many blessings he gives us each day and that we would see glimpses of God's goodness wherever we are and whatever it is we are doing. Not just in the slower pace of summer, but in every season.

# Take the Plastic-Free Challenge!



Plastic-Free July is a global movement that helps millions of people be part of the solution to plastic pollution; so we can have cleaner streets, lakes, oceans, and beautiful communities.

About Plastics:

 Hundreds of microplastics in the form of air pollution particles are invisible to the eye and can slip into lungs, blood, and lodge in organs. Scientists have found the compound BPA, a type of plastic, in 90% of Americans tested.



- 2. 80% of debris floating in our oceans is plastic. Every minute a garbage truck worth of plastic pollution ends up in the ocean.
- 3. It takes over double the amount of water to produce a plastic water bottle as the amount of water contained in the bottle.
- 4. One million water bottles are purchased every minute and less than 10% of them are recycled.
- 5. Many states have banned single use plastic bags and some have banned single use bottles.
- 6. In 2017, 26.8 million tons of plastic pollution was dumped into landfills. Landfills across the U.S. are filling up and running low on additional space.
- 7. If everyone switched to reusable bottles or cartons, we would save enough energy to power New York City for a month.
- 8. It takes 450 years for a single plastic bottle to decompose.
- 9. March 2022, 170 countries agreed to develop a global treaty to end plastic pollution– expected from production to waste management to be finalized by the end of 2024.
- 10. Plastic production will increase by 40% in the next 10 years. If we don't do anything about the plastic in our waters, oceans will carry more plastic than fish (by weight) by 2050.

The good news is, anyone can get involved to help reduce plastic waste. You can start out small, or really challenge yourself! For more information and solutions, go to <u>plasticfreejuly.org</u>

### Walk with Joyful Noise in the Coast **Guard Kid's Parade!**


It's never too early to start planning, especially when it comes to the Coast Guard parades!
