I am still basking in the afterglow of a wonderful series of services that led to Christmas. After so many years of disruptions, this is the first Christmas Eve where it seemed like everything lined up for us to worship joyfully together. I hope that you found your way to worship with us in the season, whether in person or online. We curated services aimed at a broad range of folks this year. We had a service specifically designed for young children and their families. We had a service for those who needed quiet and comfort. We had a reimagined service where we could hear the Christmas story with fresh ears. We closed with the familiar Lessons and Carols. Each in their own way made my heart sing.

Our calendars have now turned to another year. After focusing intently on the four gospels this fall, I want to turn our attention to the Old Testament, particularly looking at some of the "Greatest Hits of the Bible." There are so many stories that are crucial to understanding our faith. I suspect that many of us grew up hearing them in Sunday School or when reading a children's Bible with our family. I still have flannel graph images seared into my brain from my childhood, so we're planning to bring those back for the next several weeks.

For this series, we'll dive into Moses and the Burning Bush, the Parting of the Red Sea, Balaam's Donkey, Deborah, Samson, Ruth, and many others. If you want to dig deeper into these stories, I'd encourage you to check out the How to Read the Bible class led by Dr. Matt Bruce, which happens at 10:00 on Sundays.

The last Sunday of January will be a congregational meeting (for the purposes of approval the pastors' terms of call and electing at-large Nominations Committee members) and a time to look at the Annual Report. This meeting is a good chance for us to take stock of our blessings as a church, to see where we could improve, and to open ourselves to the opportunities before us. It will be in the Lounge between services, and I hope you will be there. The church is at its strongest when its members engage in the ministry and step forward to serve. This is a strong church, but there's always room for growth!

As we begin another year of ministry together, I invite you to join me in praying for our church. In our prayers, let us ask God to reveal clearly the way forward. Let us seek to know how we can serve our neighbors through the church. Let us seek to grow deeply in faith, hope, and love. Here's to 2025 being a great year of ministry together!

Dear Church Family,

Here's an update on what is happening with the revision of our youth ministry and the search for our next Director of Youth Ministries. In the December Tidings article the new mission statement of our youth ministry was shared: With God's help, we seek to build a Christ-centered community of acceptance that seeks to serve others.

Alongside the new mission statement, the Renovation Team, with valuable input from parents. youth group volunteers and Youth Committee members, identified several key goals. The top goal established is to provide more opportunities for service, allowing our youth to actively live out their faith while building relationships with one another. The hope is that the new mission statement and goals will empower the new Director of Youth Ministries to focus their time and energy on guiding both youth volunteers and the youth themselves to a deeper understanding of Jesus' love for them and for others.

From the Earth Care Team

Earth-Friendly Resolutions for 2025!

January is here and it's time again to make resolutions for the new year. Let's consider the earth that God gave us and take care of our home.

Start with an activity which will save you money as well as saving energy. Consumers Energy offers customers a free whole-home energy audit and will provide free product upgrades. Visit this link to schedule your audit: https://homeanalysis-consumersenergy.com/

Next, let's consider how to use less plastic. Plastics don't disappear; they degrade into harmful microplastics that affect nearly all living organisms, including us. To reduce plastic use, consider these steps:

- Use stainless steel reusable water bottles instead of plastic.
- Place groceries in reusable bags and not the grocery store plastic bags.
- When traveling use reusable or compostable utensils and plates.

Become pesticide free in your yard and home. Pesticides for insects will also kill butterflies and bees. Do an internet search on "pesticide free insect control" for ways to control insects without pesticide.

Shop local and organic whenever possible. Shopping local helps your neighbors, and shopping organic helps you and your health by eliminating additives and chemicals.

Recycle as much of your throw-away items as possible. Glass, paper, cardboard, metal cans, and plastic bottles are all recyclable.

If you have a vegetable or decorative garden, begin composting to gain new fertile soil to add to your gardens. There are many online articles to help you learn to compost.
