Dear Church Family,

I've been thinking a lot about conflict lately. God is challenging me to see conflict as an invitation to be in a more authentic relationship with others. I used to think I welcomed conflict and saw that as a badge of courage. Turns out, I'm not as courageous as I thought.

What truly takes courage, however, is to really listen to the person with whom you are in conflict *and* to risk sharing how you've been hurt. I say "risk" because it may not be received well, no matter how well you try to articulate it. By this, I mean using "I statements," such as "I felt devalued when you said/ did..." etc.

It takes a lot of energy to enter into such challenging conversations. But if we truly care about the person with whom we have tension, view them as a friend we want to keep, *and* as someone who is also made in the image of God, then we can rely on Christ for the courage to enter into conflict.

In our One Anothering small groups, we spoke about courage. A great definition of courage is to "do it scared." Courage doesn't mean the absence of fear,



but to engage with others while afraid. Afraid of how we will be received, how the other may be defensive, the fear of tension, and/ or fear of losing the relationship altogether. Those fears are real. God has been convicting me that I can't let those fears stop me, especially if the other person is important to me and that relationship is worth keeping.

It could also mean that it takes more than one awkward conversation filled with honesty. But when those conversations are

rooted in love—the same love Christ has for each of us, including those we struggle with—conflict can actually draw us closer and deepen our relationships.

But as with all things, we can't do this alone. We need the Holy Spirit to remain calm, to resist the temptation to attack those who have hurt us, and above all to approach others with Christ-like love. I know this is easier said than done, but I hope we all realize that with Christ's help and love, it can indeed be done. And we will be all the better for it.

From the Earth Care Committee: Beautifying the Church Grounds with Native Plants

Spring has brought new life to the landscaping around the church, thanks to the dedicated efforts of several church staff and congregation members.

Todd Olson and Andrew Wolfert gave our Easter flowers—daffodils and hyacinths—a second life by planting them around the church, adding cheerful bursts of color for all to enjoy.

Continuing the effort, Todd Olson and Michele Smith picked up native plants from two locations: the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) at Hemlock Crossing and Weesie's in Montague. With help from Ginger Aubrey, Michele helped arrange the plants around the front of the church. These were then planted by the Boy Scouts, creating a beautiful and sustainable landscape that everyone can appreciate.



At the entrance to Joyful Noise, children will be welcomed by a charming mix of wildflowers and strawberries—an inviting

and educational touch for our young ones.

The Earth Care Team is excited to share this native landscaping project with you and hopes it brings joy and a deeper appreciation for God's creation.

Financial Update: January - April

We are now a third of the way through the year, and we wanted to provide an update on the church's finances.

First, thank you for your faithful support of First Presbyterian Church of Grand Haven. Through April we have received \$371,500 in revenue toward the General Fund and nearly \$25,000 in special gifts for programs like One Great Hour of Sharing, Presbyterian Disaster Assistance and the Joyful Noise Scholarship Fund.

During this same period, our General Fund expenses have been \$409,200. This means that expenses exceed our revenue by about 9%. Some of this is expected as we send some of our mission agencies their gifts early in the year to help equip them for ministry, but there is still about a 5% difference. Our pledged giving at the end of April is also about 10% behind budget, which is more than the current shortfall.



If you are able, would you consider catching up on your pledged giving? Or, if your pledge is made through a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) from your IRA or as a stock gift, would you consider doing so earlier in the year than you may have in the past?
